STRENGTHEN & REBUILD "The Universe of Home"

How important is a home? Those four walls, whether they enclose a mobile home, an apartment, a modest house, or a mansion, hold a universe inside. Each of us and every child has an immediate picture formed when the word "home" is mentioned. Some children in our county do not have a safe home to picture. For them, security and peace are not the words that come to mind for home.

As of December 2018, according to an article in

The Ashe Post and Times (December 5, 2018), DSS stated that "51 children are in foster care in Ashe County, an unusually high number—with 28 of the children being kept in foster homes outside of Ashe County." For 51 of our Ashe children, their "home universe" has been shattered, and home is not the **nurturing, establishing, securing, trusting** place they deserve.

Our acronym **NEST** was formed from these words. The NEST

Alliance strongly encourages county leaders, government, local help agencies and churches to come together to implement a fully staffed and supported ongoing Child Emergency Shelter and Advocacy Center to strengthen and rebuild the "universe of home" for children in Ashe County. This is a part of our Roots and Wings mission that will require our county working together intentionally.

JANUARY IS NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH

Some Ways The NEST Alliance Has Actively Mentored Children:

1. Delivered and set up 20 beds and bedding from winter 2017 to winter 2018. Seven of the children who received beds are now part of the ongoing NEST Kids weekly program. A special thank you to Jill Breton for leading this mission.
2. Provided individualized supplies each year that fit the classroom requests to encourage success in school
3. Ensured that children have 2 new pairs of quality shoes during the school year to help encourage success and confidence
4. Helped with expenses that are extra-curricular and difficult to afford for some
5. Provided clothing as needed for children throughout the year
6. Met with children in an ongoing program weekly to consistently encourage them to make each day and each choice matter
7. Helped bring children into a loving, nurturing, life-strengthening relationship with God while actively modeling caring and compassion from all adult volunteer mentors involved in The NEST Alliance
