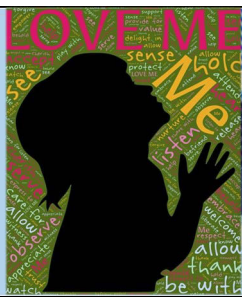

National Foster Care Month in 2025 will be observed throughout

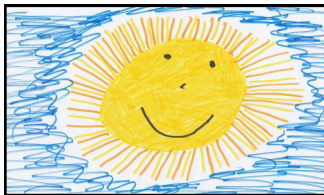

The NEST Center activity area is now completed with a heating/cooling unit, flooring and furnishings!

The center provides a fully furnished place that is made available to DSS for any child or youth taken into DSS custody who needs a comfortable and equipped place to come to for a few hours or a few days while placement is being secured. Supplies in the center's resource building, beds, and bedding continue to be made available to meet needs of children and families. In addition, The NEST Center provides a central location for The NEST Alliance transportation van, board meetings, and for outreach programs centered on those enrolled in our ongoing NEST Kids Program. Our NEST Network continues to extend into the community to meet needs, as they arise and to strengthen families and children in ways that will hopefully provide stability. We are in gratitude to all donors for their support and to all directors and volunteers who give freely of their time, talents, and hearts.
